Literacy

Comprehension

-Children will read and re-read a selection of books fluency, understanding and enjoyment.

Word Reading

- -Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known letter-sound correspondences and a few exception words.
- -Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them.
- -Read a few common exception words matched to the school's phonic programmes.

Writing Composition

Fiction- Recount

- -To write a letter from the point of view of Tom to his mother, describing what he has learned about pirate ships.
- -Attempt to write short sentences in meaningful contexts.
- -Use phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match spoken sounds
- -Apply taught diagraphs into writing.

Writing Transcription

- -Form lower-case letters correctly.
- -Write short sentences with words with known sound-letter correspondences.
- -Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s.
- -Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense.
